Together Building Africa

TOGETHER BUILDING AFRICA



On Thursday, November 15, 2018, all of our ÉESS students attended a special presentation given by local residents, Ron and Elaine Fehr. Ron and Elaine help fundraise to help build schools in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (formerly Zaire). Five years ago, ÉESS fundraised to help build the rooves of two classrooms for Les Prophetesses School in Bukavu, DRC, where Ron and Elaine have both volunteered, teaching English in Grade 6 classrooms.

Les Prophetesses School is incredibly special and dear to us as it educates children whose families could not otherwise afford to pay the tuition. Did you know that the average wage for an adult worker in the DRC is only about two dollars? Clearly, families struggle to eat, never mind paying for school tuition (it is a luxury only the small upper class can afford). They still have the photo of our students and staff on display from five years ago. They continue to be thankful to our community for our on-going support.

Another personal connection we have with Les Prophetesses School is our Grade 6 and 7 French Immersion students are currently pen pals with their Grade 6 students, whose first language is French. ÉESS is going to continue to show compassion and continue paying the kindness forward. In the New Year, we will be fundraising to help this same school to build two proper washrooms, as well as proper sanitation stations to help reduce the spread of diseases. The total cost of the project in just over \$ 10 000 USD and I am hopeful that we can challenge our community to raise half of the funds required for this project to move forward. We are going to be asking classes to help fundraise for this worthy cause! Here are some of the reflections our Grade 6 students in Mr. Schnerch's French Immersion class wrote about the "Together Building Africa" presentation.

"Throughout the presentation, I felt empathy for the people that live in Africa!" (Charley)

"One thing I learned is that we should be thankful for being able to go to school." (Miya)

"ÉESS helped build a roof on two classrooms in the past and I'm amazed that they speak 400 languages there!" (Serena)

"I learned that the people are used to squatting to go do their business. That they need to get up at 3 A.M. to get water." (Sierra)

"I learned that most kids don't go to school or get any education at all." (Kélia)

"I learned that instead of playing tug-a-war with a rope, they lock arms and pull each other. I learned that kids have to go to the principal to get toilet paper so that they can use the bathroom." (Nicholas)

"I felt very lucky that I live in Canada. I also felt very lucky that we go to school every day and learn because other places around the world can't afford to go to school." (Alexis)
